

Restrictions on exporting goods to Russia.

Ministry of Economy, Trade and Industry

(January 30, 2024)

The Ministry of Economy, Trade and Industry (METI) of Japan has issued a notice to companies in Japan regarding export restrictions on goods to Russia. They have also cautioned against the export of "Common High Priority Items."

To contribute to international peace and the resolution of the current conflict in Ukraine, the G7 and other major countries have taken measures. As part of these measures, the Japanese Export Trade Control Order (Cabinet Order No. 378 of 1949) ¹ has been partially revised to prohibit exports of certain goods to Russia, Belarus, Kyrgyz and other countries.

An investigation conducted in cooperation with major countries, including Japan, has resulted in a list of "Common High Priority Items." It is a list of parts used in Russian military weapons found in Ukraine. This list is now available to the public.
